
Dear Parishioners

I hope you will plan to join us for this wonderful evening. Our Pancake dinner will begin at 6:00 p.m. in the parish hall.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday which is February 25th. We will have Imposition of Ashes and Eucharist at 7:00 a.m., noon, and 7:00 p.m. I hope you will avail yourselves to this important day and season of Lent. usually takes two or three months. Call Gloria Lawley at 817 261-8507 if you have questions. You can also email her at tlawley@sbcglobal.net.


Note From the Editor

Evensong

The contracts for Nazard 2 2/3', Blockflute 2', and Larigot 1 1/3' ranks have been signed and the first payment mailed to Ross King. We have had another large contribution and that gives us the money needed to purchase the Tierce 1 3/5' rank. We now begin collecting the funds for the trumpet on the upper manual (swell) that plays with the ensemble. The Festival Trumpet that is already on the organ is a trumpet used only for solo melodic lines. We have \$1,455. toward the \$11,789. cost for the ensemble trumpet.

A couple of weeks ago Ross told me that the shop that makes the pipes called and asked for dimensions. So, they are beginning

constructions on the 10 ranks that we have money for. The good news is that all the pipes that we order before construction begins cost us the listed price. There will be a 10 percent surcharge added to the cost of any pipes ordered after that time. So, it would be to our advantage to get ALL the pipes that go into the new case here before Ross begins work. The following is a listing of what is still needed:

Trumpet 8'	\$11,789.
Oboe 8'	\$10,155.
Tremulant	\$1,556.
Mechanical parts	\$3,931.
Total	\$27,429.

Following are the remaining ranks to be added to the Pedal Board:

Gedeckt 16'	\$272.
Gedeckt 8'	\$272.
Contra Trumpet	\$11,506.
Trumpet	\$259.
Total	\$12,309.

Then there are two remaining sounds:

Chimes	\$7,099.
Zimbelstern	\$2,674.
Total	\$9,773.

Grand total needed: \$49,511.

At that point our project would be complete.

Jesus said, Simon son of John, do you truly love me? He answered Yes, Lord, you know that I love you. Jesus said, Feed my sheep. John 21:16, 17

Marsee Memorial Garden

Construction is under way for the Marsee Memorial Garden. The ground has been built-up or leveled as needed, the sprinkler system is laid out & all the underground electrical work has been completed. They are in the process of pouring concrete for the sidewalks, etc. By the time you read this we hopefully will have started the brick work. The contract is signed for \$70,000 and we have \$74,782.53 in the account as of the end of December. We need approximately \$25,000 more to complete the Memorial Garden which will cover the iron fencing and gate, lighting and all of the plants and trees. We are hoping to raise the funds so we can continue the construction & have the Garden completed by late spring. Please consider making a donation in memory of a loved one or in thanksgiving for God's blessings in your life. The rendering is at the north exterior door that opens to the Garden. This will be an inspiring and functional addition to St. Alban's and it is so exciting to have it finally underway.



Mardi Gras






Seder Dinner

The ceremony of the Passover Dinner grew out of God's commandment to the Jews that the exodus from Egypt and its meaning shall be remembered and told from generation to generation. "On the night in which He was betrayed" our Lord, Jesus Christ, celebrated the Passover with his disciples; however, the Jewish meal was to be changed completely because of what our Lord would do and say at the "Last Supper". It was at this meal, the Passover Seder, that Christ first instituted the Eucharist. He took the bread and wine, blessed them, and gave them to his disciples saying those words we still hear each time we receive the bread and wine of the Eucharist.

The Seder Dinner is but one of the events on Maundy Thursday. It is an instructed meal that was written with the help of a former parishioner from a Jewish background who helped to make this an authentic experience. At the meal the connection between the Seder and our Eucharist is explained. At the conclusion of the meal we move to the church and celebrate the Maundy Thursday liturgy that includes the stripping and washing of the altar. Then comes the watch at the Altar of Repose in answer to Christ's question, "Can you not watch with me one hour?" (Matthew 26:40)

On Thursday, April 9, 2009, please plan to attend our Seder Dinner here at St. Albans. It will be held at 6:00 PM in the Parish Hall. As the Lenten season draws to a close, this is a great way to wind up your Holy Week and prepare to usher in the Easter season. Tickets will go on sale after the 8:00 and 10:30 services on Sundays March 15, 22, & 29, or you can contact the church office during regular hours on weekdays. Make your reservations early, no later than March 29, because seating in the Parish Hall is limited, and it usually sells out. Nursery care will be available if enough people need it.

We are looking for home-sewn bears to distribute to VITAS Hospice patients for Valentine's Day. Fabric can be bought at WalMart (\$2.50 per yard for Valentine fabric available now), along with polyester fiberfill stuffing. Plastic safety eyes and noses are an easy addition also, and available at Hobby Lobby if you are interested.

Simplicity pattern 9524 works very well. Also available at WalMart. Other patterns are available, bear size of approximately 14 inches is desired. Each bear can be made from 1 yard of 45" fabric or 5/8 yard of 60" fabric and approximately 17 oz of polyester fiberfill.

If you're interested, we would love to have some homemade bears to show our love to our hospice patients in February. I challenge everyone who sews to make and donate 5 bears by February 6. Our Fort Worth office goal is to have 100 bears to distribute. If you have any questions or want to sign up, let me know.


