St. Alban's is indeed blessed with all the new life we have and are expecting in the parish.

Once again I remind you we are having a reception to welcome Deacon Jonathan and Elizabeth Duncan to St. Alban's on July 6th at 9:15 a.m. Please come, meet and give them a warm St. Alban's welcome. Mark your calendars for Saturday, August 9 for Fr. Duncan's Ordination to the Priesthood which will be here at St. Alban's at 10:00 a.m. It will be great to have Deacon Duncan on board on July 1st.

A number of projects will also begin in June. Our first project on our wish list for the Capital Campaign is taking place. Besides all these we will have painting done to the outside of the buildings, a new narthex floor installed; the hole in the ceiling repaired, stained glass windows to be repaired and who knows what else may be coming out of the many blessings our Lord has given us. Keep St. Alban's in your prayers as we finish up our 60th year and begin afresh our 61st year of our Lord and Savior's ministry in Arlington.

We do know what else. University Street which is north of the Church will also be under construction over the next year. The city will be replacing water and sewer pipes. I don't quite know what all this will entail when they tear up the street right next to St. Alban's, but do be warned and careful when crossing the street or driving out of our parking lots. God is blessing us with new infrastructure in our whole renewal process. Something unexpected!

Once again as summer approaches, I remind you that God does not take a vacation nor does St. Alban's Parish. We still keep the doors open, lights on, air conditioning going and ministry and prayers are still very active. So please keep your gifts and pledges current before you leave on vacation. Saturday Book Club: There will be a study beginning in June of the book *The Reluctant Healer: One Woman's Journey of Faith* by Emily Gardiner Neal. We will meet on the third Saturday of each month at 9 am in the church parlor. A review of the book states:

Emily Gardiner Neal was a skeptic in the early 1950's and a professional journalist. Strongly affected by witnessing a healing service, she felt compelled to investigate the phenomenon. She began to talk with those who were healed, their pastors, their families and their physicians. In the process, she began honestly to face her own apprehension, subsequently writing A Reporter Finds God Through Spiritual Healing. Her journey of faith and her participation in the healing ministry of the church for the next thirty years are recorded in her additional six books- all out of print. An anthology of those books has been skillfully written by Anne Cassel to share the essence of her timeless stories and her extensive research. The book, formerly titled Celebration of Healing is scripturally sound. The Episcopal Healing Ministry Foundation had sponsored the reprint of this work entitled The Reluctant Healer.

Come and join us as we read and discuss this work written by a woman who began her journey as an agnostic and eventually was ordained to the diaconate in the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh in 1978.

Camp Crucis Parish Campouts and Picnics

Camp Crucis will be working closely with the congregations of the Diocese of Fort Worth to set church campouts and picnics. St. Vincent our cathedral is leading the way with a church family campout. We have reduced the prices to encourage families to tent camp or stay in one of our air-conditioned cabins. Tent camping is \$5 per person per night with a maximum of \$15 per tent per night. Cabin rates are \$50 per night for up to 14 people. Hiking, fishing, sports equipment, and court use are free. Swimming, horseback riding, and bounce houses can be added for an additional fee. Our picnic special includes the use of DeWolfe hall and the pool use for \$5 per person. These specials are available for churches only. Kroger Rebate Program

Kroger has changed their organization rebate program, now calling it the *Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program*, replacing the Kroger Share Card. This program runs from May 1, 2008 through April 30, 2009. For those of you with Kroger *Plus* cards who used the Share Card each time you shopped, this program will be much easier. Please take a copy of the Customer Letter located in the Narthex on the Visitor's Table, and the next time you stop at Kroger have the cashier scan your *Plus* card and then the barcode in the Letter. This will enroll your *Plus* card in the Neighbor to Neighbor program for the entire year, and St. Alban's will receive a portion of \$1,000,000 that Kroger will donate to all the enrolled charitable organizations. You will no longer need to have the Share Card scanned each time you shop. St. Alban's will receive a portion of the \$1,000,000 based on the percentage of our purchases compared to the other charitable organizations.

As part of our Youth Sunday and Christian Education volunteer appreciation Sunday, graduating senior, Miss Allie Roark, was asked to share what active participation in St. Alban's parish youth and Christian education programs has meant to her. We thank her for this special offering and look forward to seeing her when she is home from college through the years.

I have gone to St. Alban's my entire life. I have learned and experienced so much here and have met some great people who have become some of my very best friends. This place is everything that I could hope for in a church and in a family. This is more than just a place to come and worship; it is a place to come and be comforted, loved, and accepted. In the time that I was participating in the youth group, I learned and grew so much as a person.

The education I have received here transcends what is typically thought of when you think of Sunday school. In these classes, you learn to know not only God, but yourself and God in yourself. The discussions in the Sunday school classes that I have been have very rarely stayed on the sole topic of the intended lesson. Just ask any of our wonderful teachers. And, although many tangents took us far from the intended point of the lesson, we still managed to learn something and found a new perspective in which to look at things. It is truly amazing how many ways can be found to relate normal, everyday occurrences which excite, frustrate, confuse and astound us and use them to find a new beauty in life, in the Scripture we study, and in applying these lessons everyday after learning this new outlook.

As some of you know, when I was in seventh and eighth grade, my family and I moved to southeast Texas and became part of the St. Stephen's family. It was there that I learned how truly advanced my Christian education really is. When I was younger, I was very shy (imagine that...), and I would only go to Sunday school with my dad. At first I thought I would just sit there and not understand. But, I was soon quite able to jump right in and contribute to the discussion.

New Beginnings has been another of the things that has really enriched and enlightened my experience here at St. Alban's. For those of you who don't know, New Beginnings is a youth retreat for seventh through ninth grade students. If you haven't gone, GO! And, if you're too old, then go to Happening, which is the retreat for tenth through twelfth grade students. I never actually made it to Happening because I was never able to find the time to go. I am truly saddened by this, so again, I'm telling you to GO! Because it will change your life! And, if you're shy and don't know anybody and think that you'll go and be miserable, throw that out the window because the friends will find you! Trust me, I know. You'll get so close to these friends during this one weekend that you'll just keep talking, and you'll have amazing friends all over North Texas because you've shared a life-altering experience that so many never get to understand. This is a bond that will keep you strong and help you through any troubled or stressful times you may experience, because you'll have people to help you through it. And, when life is great and you're just really excited, you still have someone to call and tell about it. I know you're thinking, "Well, I can get that at school or something ... " This is just different; but I digress.

I'm supposed to be up here talking about how all of these things have impacted my life. It's funny, I hadn't ever really thought about it, and when I began thinking about all of these wonderful memories I have, it made realize, I don't think I could have memories like mine from anywhere else. St. Alban's has been shaping the person I have become since before I was even born. I was baptized here. I received First Communion here. I was in Music Makers and Youth Choir when we still had it. I've done so much here, and I'm so grateful to have had that opportunity. It's the simple things in life that create some of the best memories. It's the challenges in life that define character. I would like to think that some of my best character building and memory making have been done right here. There are so many ways that St. Alban's can change people, but I know that the best way it has changed me is that it's helped me to realize everything that I've just told all of you. And, that is that this place is love. Going off to college is going to be scary, but I really believe that everything will be ok because I've learned a strong sense of faith during these many years I've come here.
