

Dear Parishioners

Although it is a time for rest and relaxation, a time to enjoy and take time off from work, we do not take time off from our worship of our Lord. Even on vacation there are parishes to go to for worship. Perhaps in our relaxed mood we will find ourselves even more open to the Word of God. Perhaps in our time away we can open ourselves to the will of the Father. Perhaps in our vacation mode we can receive the fire of the Holy Spirit and renew our devotion to God. Bring back a bulletin from the church you attended while gone. It is a great way to bring ideas and thoughts from what others are doing well and help us fulfill the commission of our Lord to go and make disciples.

Something new is being formed this month. It is the Anglican Church of North America. We will be adopting its Constitution and Canons and will culminate in the installing of Bishop Duncan as the Archbishop of the Anglican Church of North America. This is exciting! This is the calling home of many Anglicans that could not accept the direction, changes and innovations The Episcopal Church and the Anglican Church of Canada have made and continually push forward. We could not see ourselves going against the authority of Scripture and developing new ways of interpreting God's Word that is not consistent with 2000 years of Christian Teaching. We could not see ourselves submitting to the new morality and ethics that are proclaimed as right and true. We could not proclaim sin is no longer a sin nor mimic and embrace a religious culture that is increasingly going against what God revealed in his Son, Jesus

Christ who is the way, the truth and the light. We have pledged a thousand dollars to aid in the formation and operation of this new Province. If you would like to donate towards this pledge, your help would be appreciated since we are on a tight budget.

When the Primates of the Anglican Communion met in Alexandria, Egypt there was the acknowledgment that finally there was the acknowledgment that there are two incompatible religions existing in the Anglican Communion. These two religions are in conflict with each other. Rick Warren in his Foreword for Thaddeus Barnum's excellent book *Never Silent* sums it up in a very succinct He states: "What is this battle?" First and foremost, it is a courageous stand for truth-for the unchangeable authority of God's Word, the Holy Scriptures, and for the uniqueness of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and our Savior and Lord. In a world that is increasingly turning from orthodoxy to rapid relativism, some church leaders are walking from the "faith once delivered to the saints." Their immorality has poisoned their theology. God warns us to separate ourselves from those who claim the name of Christ but refuse to obey him. "They will betray their friends, be reckless, be puffed up with pride, and love pleasure rather than God. They will act religious, but they will reject the power that could make them godly. Stay away from people like that! (2 Tim. 3:4-5 NLT) This is a very good book I would recommend.

Separation has taken place not once but twice. First was the separation of the Diocese from the authority of General Convention and the leaders of the Episcopal Church. Those who chose to follow TEC also separated themselves from the Parish. The secular reason for the separation from the parish was the creation of a TEC identity in order that law suits would be filed. And a lawsuit has been filed against the Diocese as expected. This lawsuit has the purpose of "winner takes all." If the TEC entity wins the lawsuit all parish property will be changed back into the hands of General Convention and the leaders of TEC. Will we be sued as a Parish? The answer is that anyone can sue anyone for almost any reason. Therefore the answer is unknown. We will, however, be represented without cost to the parish if a lawsuit if brought against us for reasons of this conflict. Remember our job is to let the lawyers be the lawyers and the judge the judge. Our ministry is to pray for our Diocese, our Bishop, our lawyers and our judge. God will be in charge and even if all is lost we will find a place and a way and continue as God's children and family. We will hold together as a witness to the truth and God's power and mercy.

Two major events I would like to bring to your attention this month. First we will have the pleasure of having the Houston Boychoir be with us on Sunday, June 7th at the 10:30 Eucharist. This will indeed be an exceptional occasion. We will be serving them lunch in the parish hall following the Eucharist. Please give them a warm St. Alban's welcome and join us for their very special treat.

Second, we have our Patronal Feast Day which we will be celebrating on Sunday, June 21st. To celebrate our feast day we will have a potluck lunch following the 10:30 Eucharist in the Parish Hall. The Church will provide the brisket and we ask you join us with your favorite dish. Come celebrate this special day as St. Alban's family.

It has been rumored that we may begin to see some movement on the refurbishment of our Pipe Organ in June—hopefully late June. This will mean that the risers that our choir sits on will have to be dismantled and new risers built. The new case is two feet wider to hold all the pipes needed. We will need to build new risers and provide new seating for the choir after work is completed. Charlene Dorsey told me that we are just under \$50,000.00 from completing the whole project. Thank you to those who have contributed to make this possible. It will indeed enhance our worship and provide us with years of concerts and performances.

A contract has been signed for the new pews as well as choices for kneeler material. We also have agreed upon the new furniture for the Sanctuary and materials. The work will begin soon and hopefully this project will be completed late July or early August. There may be a Sunday we have to meet in the Parish Hall or just have chairs in the Church so that removal of the old pews, cleaning of the floor and installation of the new pews may proceed. Be prepared! Although the pews will look close to the present ones. There will be new richness and a few new details that will beautify our Church.

When you do go on vacation, please remember to send in or prepay your offering. So far this year we have not had to borrow from the Capital Campaign or use our line of credit thanks to your generosity and sacrificial giving. If you are not going on vacation, please attend the classes we will have available during the summer months. Fr. Duncan will be offering a class for the 20's and 30's group in Room 10 during education time and the adult Bible Study

will focus on the Apostles taught by Waller Poage. It is with sadness that Dr. Nell Noonan will no longer be leading the Bible Studies on Wednesdays. She has been overwhelmed with the response from her book and feels called to focus upon the care-giving ministry. We wish her well and may she be blessed in her new ministry. Please pray for these Bible Classes as we look for a new leader. These groups will continue their Bible Study.

Vacation Bible School is just around the corner. There are lists in the entrance of the Church to volunteer and the items needed for VBS. Always needed are children to participate in this exciting program. Spread the word and invite! How will they know of this great program unless we invite them to participate? Drop by and see what is going on because it is always a rewarding experience.

Music Corner

Tales From The Loft:

We completed collecting this past month the amount needed for the ensemble trumpet that will go in the new case. Since we don't know when the pipes will begin arriving at Ross's shop, I think the prudent thing to do is collect the funds needed to make the contracted ranks play when they are installed. What will happen after the pipes arrive is that Ross will come and take out the pipes that will be used with some of the new pipes to make new ranks. Those pipes will need to be rescaled and revoiced by his artisans. Then the remaining pipes will be removed from the case and the case removed from the loft. The additional new case will be reassembled in the loft and the new pipes put in place. At that

point, tuning of the pipes will take place and then we will be able to hear them!

The mechanical parts needed to make these new pipes play cost \$3,931. As of the time of writing we still need \$2,420.75. After we get this amount we will go back collecting money for ranks of pipes. We still need the oboe rank and a remulant stop for this case. \$11,711. is needed for these remaining items for this new case. Remember there may be a 10% surcharge if we don't sign a contract for these before Ross begins work. \$23,632. is the cost for the additional pipes still needed for the pedal. This includes chimes and a zimbelstern.

As of this writing, we need a total of \$37,764. to complete THE PLAN to rehabilate our parish instrument. Remember either small or large amounts will reduce this amount. Any amount given on a regular basis adds up to an even greater amount. It's never too late to begin this way of giving.

Marsee Memorial Garden

Hopefully you have been watching the progress being made on the Memorial Garden on the north side of the church. The wrought iron fence is in place as well as the cast stone work and crosses. They will begin on the columbarium/fountain structure soon. The contract for this phase is for \$70,000 and we are making payments to the contractor from that amount. We have an additional \$6,707.53 in the account which will be enough to complete the iron fencing and gate & the handrails.

To complete the Garden we need \$12,000 for the 25 niches with granite fronts that will complete the columbarium. I have been working with Gretchen Hosea on the lighting and we will need approximately \$10,000 for light fixtures, path lighting & bullet lights in the tree to light the crosses, etc. We are still working on this & hope to cut that figure down some. The 7 benches will cost around \$4,000. The pricing we had for the landscaping was \$9.000. We will have this rebid when everything else is complete. Please consider making a donation in memory of a loved one or in thanksgiving for the blessings in your life. It is thrilling to see the Memorial Garden finally becoming a reality and we want to complete it as soon as possible so we can all enjoy it.



Diocesan Convocation May 2, 2009

On May 2 the Diocese of Ft. Worth held a special Convocation at St. Vincent's Cathedral in Bedford to discuss our new constitution and what would be expected of us as members of the Anglican Province in North America. All of St. Alban's delegates and clergy were present.

Bishop Iker began by reminding us that we are a pilgrim people in an ever changing environment because we are "in the world" but that our moral imperative needs to remain constant. We are not starting a new church just as Henry VIII didn't start a new church but allowed the Anglican Church to renew the Catholic Church. We didn't start a new church during the Revolution but created an arm of the Anglican church. The three speakers were then introduced. They were The Rev. Canon Daryl Fenton, Anglican Communion Network whose

topic was "Why do we need a new Province?", The Rt. Rev. William C. Wantland, Assisting Bishop of the Diocese whose topic was "Summary of the proposed Constitution and Canons" and Dr. Michael Powell, Director of Forward in Faith, North America whose topic was "A lay person's view of the new Province."

Canon Daryl Fenton posed and answered two questions:

- 1. Why do we need to separate and re-align ourselves with the new Anglican Province of North America?
- a. The Episcopal Church is no longer an orthodox church and is in fact anti-orthodox.
- b. The Archbishop has shown himself to be complicit and has shown a leaning toward the revisionists.
- c. The Revisionist wing is very small- 800,000 in the U.S. while the orthodox Anglicans are growing rapidly here and in Africa. The 52 million Anglicans which now make up the orthodox Communion are overwhelmingly orthodox. This shows there is a hunger for the historic faith.
 - 2. Why should we re-align at this time?
 - a. This is the time to "come out of our silos."
 - b. Only 12% of those under 30 attend any church regularly.
- c. Since the upcoming generation has voiced a desire for a traditional, orthodox and "real" church, we are in a position to act as a catalyst for this generation.
- d. Leadership sees the acceleration of our union as an act of obedience to God and the Common Cause Council sees this as urgent.

Daryl Fenton briefed the assembly on how the Constitution and Canons of the Anglican Province of North America will differ from TEC. The following is a brief summary.

The main governing body will be the Council which is made up of the bishop, clergy and laity. This council will meet annually and will represent the diocese. Each diocese shall retain its autonomy and shall be the basis for the Council.

The College of Bishops will meet as needed.

The Assembly will include the bishops, delegates and laity and will be required to meet every 5 years or less. This body will be seated as a unicameral body not a bicameral body as they were in TEC.

The head of the Province will be the Archbishop. The first Archbishop will be Rev. Bob Duncan of Pittsburgh.

The new Constitution spells out the basis of the church and reaffirms the Lambeth Quadrilateral. It will be based on scripture, the creeds, restoration of the Athanasian Creed, the sacraments and apostolic succession.

Some important aspects of the new Constitution are:

- a. No diocese will be forced to give up its basic authority to the Province.
 - b. Each diocese shall retain its property
 - c. Reaffirmation of the life-long intent of marriage
- d. Ordination of women to the priesthood shall be left to each diocese.
 - e. Bishops must be men

The Constitution and Canons will be presented for approval on June 22

Dr. Powell spoke on why we should as laity support and become a member of the Anglican Province of North America. A few of his reasons are:

- a. We are witnessing the "decay of traditional Anglican values."
 - b. "Scripture still has the answers."
 - c. We must be "part of the restoration of the biblical faith."
 - d. We should see our problems as "opportunities to minister."
- e. We must "get back to the foundations of our faith and realize that institutional idolatry and placing infrastructure ahead of the gospel is wrong."
- f. Forming a Province is "the only way to stay in communion with the growing world-wide Anglican Communion."

Bishop Iker reminded all of us that the formation of the Anglican Province of North America is "just one step on our Christian journey." We must continue to "step out in faith and be faithful to the scriptures." He concluded with the declaration that the focus of our North American Anglican Province will be: "MISSION AND EVANGELISM." We must reach out to all peoples and find ways to be a missionary force in all our communities.

We hope that this information is helpful and that by being informed, we all will be able to do our part in the reawakening of authentic and traditional Anglicanism in our nation.
