Dear Parishioners

This July we welcome Fr. Maneikis to our staff. He has agreed to be our assisting priest. His ministry will focus to help us by celebrating and preaching at the Saturday Eucharist and Sunday evening Eucharist. Fr. Maneikis is still very active in ministry at the Union Gospel Mission and we are very fortunate and happy that he has joined us on staff. Many of you know that Fr. Maneikis is no stranger to St. Alban's. He was on staff about ten years ago. So welcome home Fr. Maneikis!

July also finds our choir taking a short vacation. I want to express my gratitude for all they do during the year. They have indeed enriched our worship and have done a superb ministry through all their dedication and practices through the year. Thank you Dorinda our organist, Thomas our choir director and Vicki our youth choirs director. All your leadership and ministry are greatly appreciated.

Not only did the choir go on vacation but the swell section of the organ has started its vacation. Today they took pipes, the blower and the swell slats away to be used in the new case. We also thank Sowing Seeds and members of the choir for their help in dismantling the risers in the choir loft. The last Sunday of June the choir had a different seating arrangement and the organ console was in a new place. I thank all those who have so generously given for the refurbishment and expansion of our organ. Charlene has worked hard on this project and promises to have some special concerts for us when the organ is completed. Thank you, Charlene.

I want to thank Sheryl Fritz and the donor of the material for remaking our St. Alban's Banner. The silk was fraying and pulling apart. Sheryl took the banner apart piece by piece and re-applied it to the new material. It looks magnificent. Thank you for all your hard work. We thank the donor for giving the funds for the very rich material needed.

As of this point, the new pews are being made. The time schedule is still the same---late July or early August. We will have to keep from entering the Church while the floors are being completely stripped of years and years of wax. When that is complete we will have the installation of the new pews. I cannot wait to see them.

On Saint Alban's Day I asked you to start a buzz around St Alban's. Have you started? Where is God calling St. Alban's as a parish. Where is God calling us as individuals of St. Alban's? Have we started praying about it? Have we started to think about it? Have we begun to ask ourselves how we can deepen and enrich what God's has called us to? Yes, we have had a rather full year already as I outlined in my sermon. But what do you believe will further St. Alban's to fulfill what God has called us to?

In my sermon I asked: For 60 years St. Alban's had a ministry and calling to excellence in education. Is God calling us to expand our education in the knowledge and love of our Lord? Perhaps a traveling education group that goes to the Holy Land, walks in the footsteps of our Lord? Perhaps it is to walk in the footsteps of that great apostle Paul through Greece and Asia? Or perhaps our knowledge needs to be enriched in our Anglican Heritage in England?

Is God urging us on to a new school for the Arlington community? Is an elementary school in our future? Or perhaps it is a school or center for trouble teens and their families? Are we to bring together the resources of our community as well as Christian Family teaching? Perhaps it is a center that could aid those teens who are lost, or angry or helpless in their situation?

Is God urging us to Mission? Are we being asked to create and form a mission team to help those in orphanages in Mexico? We heard about the wonderful ministry happening in Peru a few weeks ago. Is God calling us to evangelize in Peru? Our Diocese is in a companion relationship with the Diocese of Northern Malawi. Do we need to be ambassadors for Christ for Africa?

Are we being urged on to evangelize right here at home? Are we to go and make new disciples? Are we to baptize, to teach, to share

the Good News in Christ? Are we to make a goal or a vision to grow by 25 new families each year for the next two years? Are we raising up leaders to Christ to take on the ministry Christ has called them to with passion, faith, hard work and love?

I am giving these few questions not as answers but as suggestions for you to start your buzzing. We have been blessed by God here at St. Alban's. We have been urged because of his love to go forward in confidence as ambassadors for him. For 62 years St. Alban's has been called to do the work the Lord has called us to do. What greater things is he calling us to, both personally and as his body for the next 62 years?

Next month at Rally Day we will have a form and a receptacle for you to place your thoughts in. Be thinking about it. Be praying about it. Be buzzing with each other about it. Where is God calling us further in our faith, our belief and our hope?

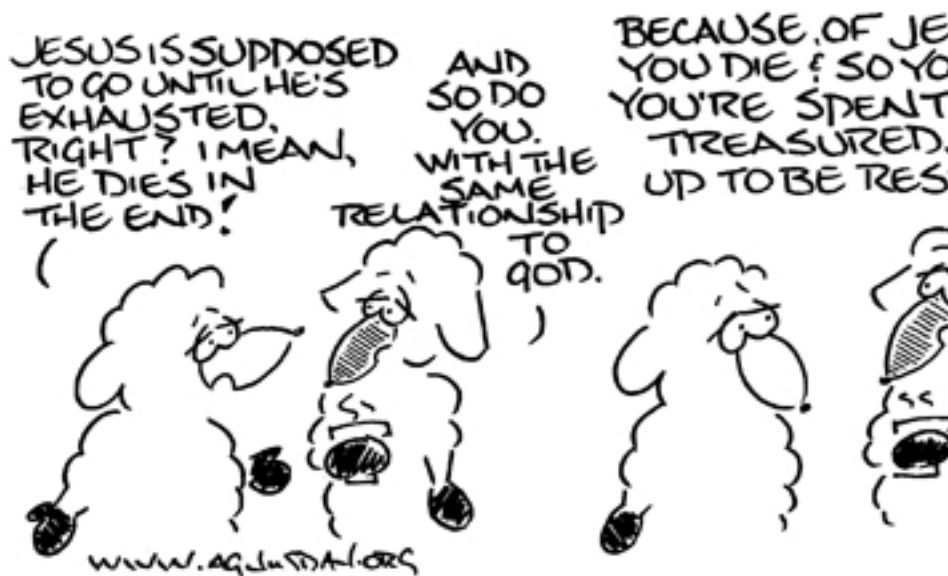

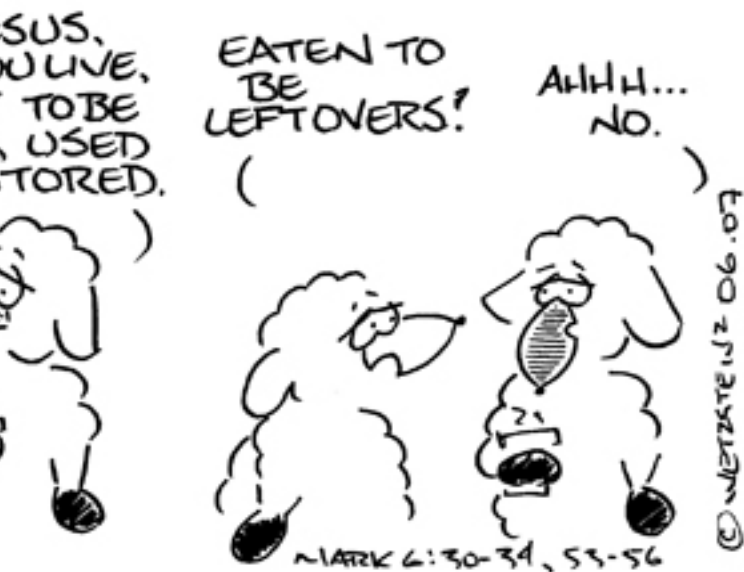

Prayers & Squares Quilt Ministry

Prayers & Squares is an international interfaith outreach ministry that began in 1992 in Rancho Bernardo, CA and now has chapters in 8 countries around the world. Unlike many other organizations that make quilts for charitable causes, the purpose of Prayers & Squares is just not to make and distribute quilts, but to promote prayer through the use of quilts. Many quilts have been distributed through the groups, each a special gift of love. They have been made for sick babies, for cancer and AIDS patients, for adults and children facing surgery or personal crisis; for many reasons, but each for someone in special need of prayer

The idea behind these prayer quilts is simple. Members of the group make a lap quilt and when completed, a heavy thread is used to take stitches through the quilt layers. The ends are left free to be tied with a square knot. As each knot is tied by a member of the faith community or by friends, a silent prayer is said for someone in special need, who then receives the finished quilt. And while the quilts can

be detailed or very simple, we are reminded of the motto of the group: "It's not about the quilt; it's all about the prayers."

There are 55 chapters in Texas alone – in Arlington, chapter 723 began at SS Peter & Paul in December 2007. On Saturday, August 15th from 10am till 2pm, SS Peter & Paul will host a regional conference of Prayers and Squares chapters and individuals interested in learning more about this ministry. Lunch will be provided.

Kroger Plus Shopper's Card Program

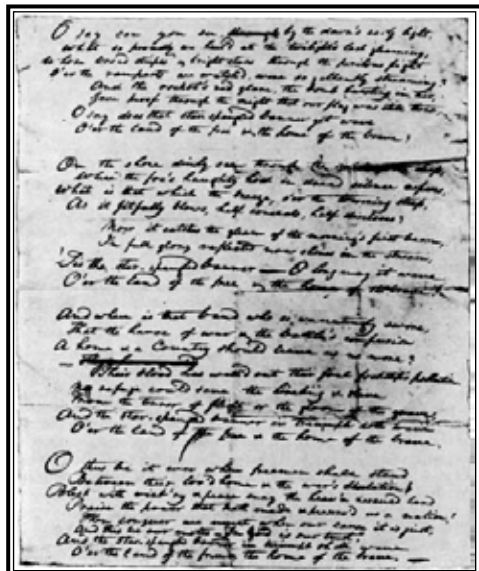

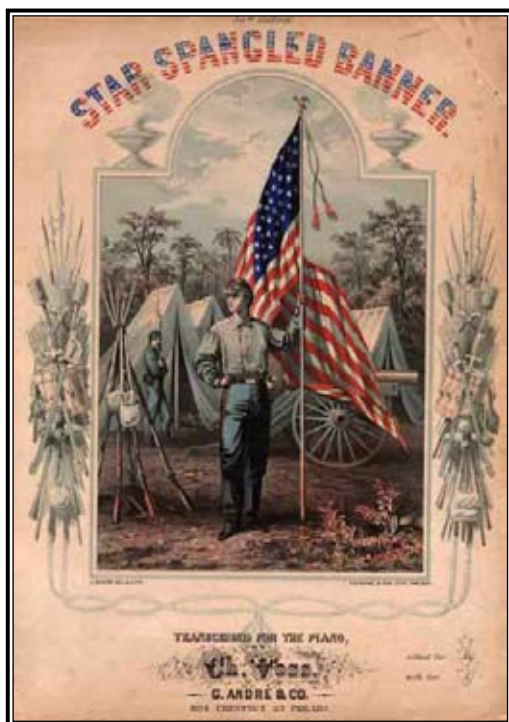

Our National Anthem

Since this is July's newsletter, I found it fitting that the whole text of the hymn *The Star Spangled Banner* be presented in honor of Independence Day. According to www.thenationalanthemproject.org, "The song of our nation was penned by Washington attorney Francis Scott Key at a dramatic moment during the War of 1812. On the night of September 13, 1814, Key watched as our country was attacked by the British navy at Fort McHenry. After watching the rockets' red glare and bombs bursting in air throughout the night, dawn broke. Key was expecting to find Baltimore firmly under British control, but was stunned to see a battered but still flying American flag waving in the sunrise. So inspired was Key that he wrote the poem, "The Star-Spangled Banner." Set to a tune attributed to John Stafford Smith, "To Anacreon in Heaven," it became America's national anthem in 1931."

O say, can you see, by the dawn's early light,
What so proudly we hailed at the twilight's last gleaming?
Whose broad stripes and bright stars, through the perilous fight,
O'er the ramparts we watched, were so gallantly streaming?
And the rocket's red glare, the bombs bursting in air,
Gave proof through the night that our flag was still there.
O say does that star spangled banner yet wave
O'er the land of the free, and the home of the brave?

On the shore dimly seen through the mists of the deep.
Where the foe's haughty host in dread silence reposes,
What is that which the breeze, o'er the towering steep,
As it fitfully blows, half conceals, half discloses?
Now it catches the gleam of the morning's first beam,
In full glory reflected now shines in the stream:
'Tis the Star-Spangled Banner! O long may it wave
O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave.

And where is that band who so vauntingly swore
That the havoc of war and the battle's confusion
A home and a country should leave us no more?
Their blood has washed out their foul footsteps' pollution.
No refuge could save the hireling and slave
From the terror of flight, or the gloom of the grave:
And the Star-Spangled Banner, in triumph doth wave
O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave.

O thus be it ever when freemen shall stand
Between their loved homes and the war's desolation!
Blest with vict'ry and peace, may the Heaven-rescued land
Praise the Power that hath made and preserved us a nation.
Then conquer we must when our cause it is just
And this be our motto: "In God is our Trust."
And the Star-Spangled Banner in triumph shall wave
O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!

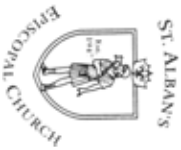
