

Dear Parishioners

October starts off with a woof, meow and any other kind of noise your pets make. We have Blessing of the Animals on Saturday, October 4th at 10 a.m. in the Parish Hall. Instead of having our regular Eucharist in the Church (we have a wedding later this day) we will hold the Eucharist and the Blessing of the Animals in the Parish Hall. We invite you to bring your pet(s) and join us for this wonderful custom on St. Francis Day.

Also on the 3rd and 4th of October the Brotherhood of Saint Andrew is having a retreat at Camp Crucis. The topic will be "The Cost of Discipleship." Fr. Lee Nelson who spoke at one of our Lenten Programs will be the speaker. Many of you know his parents, Paul and Debbie Nelson, who are faithful members of St. Alban's. Although we don't have a Brotherhood of St. Andrew's, all men are invited to the retreat. If there is interest, The Brotherhood of St. Andrew's is a worthwhile ministry for men and might be something we look forward to establishing.

On the 11th of October The Women's Congress meets at St. John's. Information and registration forms have been in your bulletin. I hope we will have a good showing from St. Alban's. Also on the 11th will be a baby shower for Fr. and Melisa Matkin's expected addition. All women of the Parish are invited from 2 to 4 p.m. to join us at the Rector's home for this expectant celebration. The décor of the baby's room will be Winnie the Pooh. Just so you know, they are expecting a baby girl.

On the 18th we will have our rescheduled Picture Scavenger Hunt for adults of the Parish. This as I stated last month will be a great time for fellowship and fun. You don't have to have a digital camera to join in. You can be paired with another that does. We will meet following the scavenger hunt in the Parish Hall for dessert and fellowship.

October 26th will be our Fall Youth Sunday. Our youth will be asked to read, usher, acolyte and participate in ministries our adults do. Did not our youth choirs do a superb job in September? They sung beautifully! We do not see Vicki Keller around St. Alban's except when our youth choirs sing. I want to thank her for the great ministry she is providing for our children. If your child has not yet signed up for youth choir, please come and join in the fun. The youth choir will also be singing this Sunday.

We wrap up October with our Trunk 'n Treat for the children on Sunday, October 26th . This is always a wonderful and safe event. Last year our Boy Scouts did an excellent job setting up special effects that enhanced the whole atmosphere. There will also be a free will offering taken to help with Thanksgiving for Pearlie that has been a long time tradition around St. Alban's. Invite your friends to come and trunk 'n treat with us. I hope you will come and support this activity by dressing your trunk in Halloween attire.

October will also see a number of changes around the physical plant. As I write this article they have already installed a new roof on Cawthron Hall. They started the new roof on the Bookstore as well. Next will be Canterbury House and the second story roof above

our classrooms. Once these roofs are done, our painters will start painting the upper part of the building. On October 6th we will see scaffolding being installed around the main Church. This will be followed by the removal of the Church roof and the installation of a slate roof. Finally, the large flat room will be repaired. The portions of our stained glass windows that were damaged during the storms including our Mary, Joseph, and Baptismal windows will be taken to a stained glass studio for repair during this time also. Our Rose Window above the Altar will also be taken out and repaired. All

except the painting will be financed by our insurance claims. The new floor in the Narthex has already been replaced. This was also covered by insurance. If you have not seen it yet, I hope you will.

The Capital Campaign projects also are continuing. The painting of the outside of the physical plant is one of the projects that will be completed soon after the roofs are repaired or replaced. It was also determined that the four columns outside the entrance could no longer be repaired and thus were replaced. They will be painted also as the painters move around the building. Our next project will help us see a whole lot better. The new lighting for the Church will be installed. The final decisions have been made and this will indeed be a wonderful addition for many of us.

Other projects we have in the works are our Organ expansion and the Marsee Memorial Garden. Through some very generous gifts we have been blessed with we have signed the contract for the new second case to be built. We have also received enough to afford some new ranks of pipes to be installed in the new case. I am sure Charlene has given an update in this Legate so please see her article. We will also have to rearrange the choir loft due to the new case. We may need some volunteers to break down the risers in the choir loft and rebuild some new ones to fit the new arrangements.

The first phase of the Marsee Memorial Garden will begin soon after the repairs to the roofs are done. The contract to complete the first phase has been signed and materials purchased to keep the rising costs down. Look for this improvement to come in a very short time. The second phase which includes landscaping is on hold until more funds are available.

In October we begin focusing upon stewardship — our stewardship to God and all that He has given us. We face a time when our financial institutions are in crisis as well as possibly facing a recession. It effects all of us to varying degrees and varying ways. I ask you now to prayerfully start considering the many blessings God has given you. I ask you to prayerfully begin to consider what God is calling you to do in relation to your giving. Perhaps He is calling you to dig a little deeper if you are able. Perhaps He is calling you to give more of your time and talent. Perhaps He is asking you to have a little more faith and trust in Him. I know we face some possible difficult times, but we also must consider how much trust and faith we have in the God who has given us all, even his Son Jesus to die for our sins.

As you know, St. Alban's has many and various ministries. We

have a host of activities to participate and become involved in. We have a lot of improvements going on to allows St. Alban's to continue to grow and be a shining light to God's honor and glory. It is indeed a blessing to be part of such a great Christian community.

From the Music Ministry:

The start of the new season here at St. Alban's has been exciting! The children's choirs are off to a great start, the Chamber Choir is diligently preparing exciting music for the Fall, and we are thrilled to welcome several new faces to our ensembles. If you are still considering participation in our ministry, it is always a great time to join us!

It is with excitement that I announce a generous donation to the music ministry of St. Alban's. Last month we received an anonymous donation of \$2000 from a parishioner, contingent upon the parish matching these funds, to begin a scholarship program for local music students. I am excited about the opportunity to begin this ministry which will serve as an outreach program to young adults in our community and bring great offerings to our worship. If funds can be secured, we hope to provide scholarships in the amount of \$2000 to up to four singers enrolled in local university music schools. In exchange for these scholarships, the students will participate in our Chamber Choir, providing musical leadership in our weekly services. The inclusion of these "semi-professional" musicians will provide invaluable leadership to our dedicated singers ultimately allowing us to advance our quest to bring offerings of the highest musical quality to our worship. In addition, this is an opportunity for young music students to become exposed to the rich music traditions of the Anglican Church. I personally received a similar scholarship during my college years as a singer at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in San Antonio. This experience was my first exposure to the Anglican Church and its music and led me to many years in the Episcopal Church and ultimately to my position here at St. Alban's. It was through a program like this that I was able to find a church home in the Episcopal Church and learn the skills needed to lead the music ministry with musical appropriate to the Anglican liturgy. In many ways, my time at St. Mark's was much like my student teaching in preparation for my work as a choral director in the public schools. Please consider making a donation to this fund as we work to start this new tradition at St. Alban's and meet the matching challenge posed with our first donation. I believe this will be a wonderful outreach project of our parish and will bring a long lasting impact on our parish and community as we educate these students in the traditional music of our church.

We are planning a musical outing in October for members of our music ministry and would be thrilled to invite any other parishioners that are interested. The Orpheus Chamber Singers of Dallas are presenting a concert in our area. This group of professional singers has received rave reviews during their 10 years of existence as one of the premier choral ensembles in North America. The choir will

Sunday School Corner

You are my hiding place.
Psalm 32:7

My family is in a crisis right now. I know many of you are, too. Isn't there always one just around the corner? One of the meditations I read last week from Oswald Chambers, My Utmost For His Highest says, "God's training ground, where the missionary weapons are found, is in the hidden, personal, worshipping life of the saint." To paraphrase, he continues, 'If we haven't been worshipping in everyday occasions, and training in Bible study and prayer, in our own home, we will be unfit for the battle when it arrives.' As I was planning this article, I kept thinking about this concept where our children and youth are concerned. As faithful sponsors and witnesses to them in baptism, we must encourage 'spiritual fitness' in the 'dailies'. Talking the talk, walking the walk, (Deut. 6:4-9), and continuing to provide them with opportunities to participate in Bible study and Christian fellowship and discussions on Sunday mornings with mentors and peers. I pray these weekly offerings will go a long way in helping them prepare for life's battles, where they can breathe deep and know with certainty, "If God is for me, who can be against me?"

We had a great September beginning to our Christian Education program. We have amazing volunteers for our children and teens.

We do, however, need more. Would you be willing to teach a class once or twice a month? Please call me and find out where you are needed in this ministry.

Confirmation will be November 2nd and First Communion will be celebrated on November 23rd, both at 10:30am. Stewardship Corner

Two brothers have just finished a long day at sea. They are sun-burnt, dirty, and tired from just trying their best to make ends meet. Then a new rabbi comes by and asks them to give it all up so they can come along and help him fish for people. In another scene, a family gets a letter in the mail from their church asking them to make a pledge to support its gospel ministry. After a hard day at work, facing a sluggish economy, rising prices, and the needs of their family, the mother and father talk about whether they should commit their dollars to the work of their parish family.

The two scenarios, separated by nearly two thousand years, are just as demanding and possibly just as influential for the future of the spreading of the kingdom of God. Behind them both is the stark reality that God calls us to be part of His plan—not necessarily when we feel like we are able to contribute, but when He knows that we are.

I have seen the blessings in my own life magnified when I have surrendered control to God. Not always monetarily, even though I feel God is waiting for us to surrender so he can bless us financially, but in spiritual ways of that "peace that passes understanding" kind that is the greatest blessing of all. I have found that we need to let go and "let God".

I want to tell a story that I heard on Christian radio that highlights this concept. A little girl named Amy is out with her mother at a five and dime store and spots a necklace of fake pearls that dazzles her. "On Mommy can I get this necklace?" The mother sees the price tag and states, "Ten dollars? I don't think so, but remember your birthday is coming up and I can let you do some things around the house so that in no time you can buy them."

Amy saves and saves and in no time she has saved enough to buy her treasure. Amy loves her new necklace and displays it to everyone. Well Amy has a loving father who every night tells her a bedtime story and then kisses her good night. One night after the story, Amy's father asks Amy if she loves him. Amy replies, "Oh Daddy you know I do." Then the father asks, "Well Amy give me your necklace." "Oh no Daddy, not my new necklace." The father tells her that is okay and tells her he loves her and kisses her goodnight.


This happens several times until one night the father comes in and notices Amy is crying. As he asks her what is wrong, she reaches out her trembling hand and gives her father her prized fake necklace. The father reaches for her necklace with one hand and with the other hand reaches into his pocket and takes out a shiny new genuine pearl necklace that he had bought for her. He had them the whole time and was just waiting for Amy to give up the fake stuff so he could give her real treasure. How much is our Father in heaven waiting to bless us with? He is just waiting for us to give up the dime store stuff so he can bless us with real treasure.

When you contemplate your gift to St. Alban's this year, remember to let go and "let God."




