Dear Parishioners

We start off the month of October with the Blessing of the This will take place in the Parish Hall on Saturday, October 3rd at 10:00 a.m. We will celebrate the Eucharist and have the Blessing of the Animals. Come, bring your pets and join us for this special event.

On Sunday, October 4th we will have our Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Jack Leo Iker with us for Confirmation, Renewal of Baptismal Vows and Baptism. This is always an important event and day in the life of the Parish when our Bishop is here and we gather as Christ's family. While we will have our regular scheduled Eucharist's in the morning, I hope there will be a special effort to join us at the 10:30 Eucharist for the Bishop's visitation. After this great celebration not only of the Eucharist but Confirmation and Baptism, we will have a potluck reception in the Parish Hall. Mark vour calendars for Sunday, October 4th at the 10:30 Eucharist and then join us for the potluck and reception following. Your delicious side dishes as always will be appreciated and devoured. The Church will provide brisket and dessert.

As most people are aware litigation was brought against our Diocese by the shadow Diocese that formed after we voted to leave the authority of General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States of America and associated with the Province of the Southern Cone. I ask for your continued prayers for our judge, Judge Chupp, our lawyer, Shelby Sharpe and his team, and for clarity in judgment. Unfortunately it will most likely be appealed by the litigants again and again. This is why we must continue to pray, continue to devote fasting to these lawsuits and hearings. I wish I could announce it is over and done with but I am afraid the answer we receive is one that will not be accepted by those who brought the case against us. It is sad indeed that many of our friends for many years are caught in this very painful situation. Please keep saying your prayers.

October is also when we begin to hear about Stewardship. We have been blessed this year by your most generous and loving gifts and pledges. We have already cut \$72,000.00 from our projected budget deficit this year and still have more savings to be realized the rest of the year. We have not borrowed from our line of credit since January. Funds borrowed have stood at \$27,000 since January. We have not had to borrow from the Capital Fund to be able to fund necessary operating expenses. This is all great news and a blessing from God. I give praise and thanks.

Next year we will have expenses that will need your continuing support. Our generous gift and the Diocese giving of half our Curate's expenses will end in July. Ministry around St. Alban's always seems to be supported well but is often working with a shoe string budget. Maintenance of our facilities is always a great expense that keeps rising. There are staff members who could use a bump in their income with prices rising as it is for everyone. I hope you will keep these few items in your prayers and thoughts as we ponder our response to God and his love towards us. Perhaps more time can be given to a ministry. Perhaps we can use our talents in new and creative ways. Perhaps our treasurer is a gift we can share more abundantly.

I have received 18 response forms on "What do you believe will further St. Alban's to fulfill what God has called us to do?" The responses were varied. A clothing closet; small group ministries; monthly potluck; be more involved in community through outreach; be more involved in mission; encourage children's presence; have a preschool through 3 year old daycare; after school program for teens; promote renewal program participation for youth; bring in guest preachers for stewardship and evangelism; upgrade playground; change service times; observe black history month; men's ministry and fellowship; and more fellowship opportunities. While this is a summary of ideas given, these are all wonderful ideas and I thank you for taking the time and effort in sharing them. I will share them

with the Vestry, Stewardship Committee and Staff. We will need to seek unity and priority as we try to move forward in faith.

I have received one volunteer that is willing to help make needlepoint seats for the two chairs by the lectern and by the pulpit, outside the communion rail. If this is something you could give your time and talent to, please see me as soon as possible.

Kountry Kitchen has been a long time outreach event of St. Alban's Parish. The funding raised by this event goes to differing community organizations as outreach. However our long time coordinator of this event is unable to continue this year. If this is a ministry you would like to lead this year, your help would be greatly appreciated. Please let me know as soon as possible. It is something that I hope we can do, but without a leader, I am afraid we will have to let this great event have a rest this year. Kountry Kitchen is also a time when many new and familiar faces shop our bookstore. Please encourage your friends and family to come and shop at St. Alban's Bookstore during this time of year.

Our new pews are in and look great. There are still a few minor adjustments needed. These will be corrected in the near future. The fountains are installed in the Marsee Memorial Garden. Funds are needed to complete the columbarium, electrical, lights, landscaping and benches. We are inching closer to finishing this project. The Organ expansion is well on its way. The new case is towering in the balcony. There are a few more ranks of pipes needed before it is finished. The roof is being repaired right now to stop the leaks we experienced in that long rainy time we had. The classrooms for our children for Sunday School are finished. Our facilities keep improving and getting better all the time. May we use them to God's glory and glorify God by our use of them.

Don't forget Trunk N Treat on Halloween, October 31st . Our Boy Scout Troup #82 will be helping out again this year so it will be fun. The first of November is the Feast of All Saints' which falls on a Sunday this year. The second of November is All Soul's Day. We will remember those who have died in the Lord at a 10:00 am Eucharist and at 6:30 pm Eucharist on November 2nd. Forms will be available mid October for you to list those you wish to have remembered.

A Few Notes From the Music Ministry

Tales From The Loft:

By the time you read this our newest case should be finished, the pipes in place, tuned, and playable! This week Ross's technicians are assembling the case. St. Alban's isn't the only church on Davis in the mist of organ construction. St. Maria Coretti is getting an organ by another Fort Worth builder, Dan Garland. It is larger than ours and should be playable about the same time ours is.

We still need \$1256.17 for the Oboe rank. The ensemble trumpet rank that we have ordered has not yet arrived at the organ shop, and consequently has not been installed. After the Oboe rank the only item left to go in this case is the tremulant costing

\$1,556. All of the pipes in this case sound on the upper manual, the Swell. The display pipes that will sit in front of the shutters are the Principal 8' rank that will sound on the pedal. This rank has not been ordered. Nor have the remaining ranks to sound on the pedal board. Two additional special sounds, the zimbelstern and chimes costing \$10,751. will complete THE PLAN.

We need to finish the Swell and then complete the additions to the pedal board. So, keep the money coming and we will see our project completed.

Marsee Memorial Garden

Progress is being made on the Memorial Garden and we will soon have the first phase & part of the second phase completed. A total of \$78,972.53 has been donated for the garden. The iron fence & gate, handrails & plaques which were in phase II have been completed at a cost of \$7,725.00. In the original bid the columbarium structure with the cross on top was priced separately from the actual niches with the granite fronts. We need to complete the structure with niches at the same time for structural purposes. We need an additional \$11,252.00. to complete this part of the garden.

We will then need the light fixtures, benches and plants to complete the garden. We are still working with Gretchen Hosea on pricing for the fixtures. The price I received last week for the wood benches w/backs is \$750.00. There are 7 benches in the plan for a total of \$5,250.00. We will than look at bids for the plants & trees to complete the project. Please consider making a donation in memory of a loved one or in thanksgiving for the blessings in your

life. It is thrilling to see the Memorial Garden finally becoming a reality and we want to complete it as soon as possible so we can all enjoy it.


The Brotherhood, which was founded in 1883, has the goal to bring men into a saving faith in the Lord Jesus Christ through study, prayer and service.


