- You must first ask that person if they will accept a prayer quilt.
- Fill out a Prayer Quilt Request Form which you will find on the counter in the narthex. Turn this form in to the church office.
- If there is a prayer quilt available, you will be contacted to choose one for the recipient (or one can be chosen for you).
- Arrangements will be made to have the quilt available at Saturday and Sunday services for parishioners to tie the threads while they say a prayer for the recipient. You are encouraged to be available to help with this part of the process.
- The quilt will be blessed by one of the clergy.
- You can then deliver the quilt to the recipient. If that person is out of town, we will mail it for you.

There are opportunities for everyone to help. If you don't sew, there is fabric to iron or measure, ties to attach, fabric to sort. We want to start a scrapbook to show the quilts we have sent. The Prayers and Squares group will meet on the first Saturday of each month at the church, 9am — noon. Of course, we would like to see many more children coming to Sunday School. A stage has been built in this room and it's our intention to make this an interactive and fun learning time with skits and videos and singing. We are compelled as Christian parents and grandparents to teach our children God's words. Not because we think it's a good idea, but because God commands it. God's true word in Deut. 5:7 tells us to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children." If it were me, I'd go back and add an exclamation point here. And in Deut. 32:46 God's true word says "Take to heart all the words I have solemnly declared to you this day, so that you may command your children to obey carefully all the words of this law. They are not just idle words – they are your life." Not my words but God's words. How intentional are you about teaching our children?

The place to find out what God wants is in His Word. In John 1:39 and 1:43 Jesus said, "Come, ... and you will see." And "Follow me." The disciples of Jesus show us what "follow me" looks like. It

looks like meeting Him face to face. It looks like obeying His words. It looks like spending time with Him. It looks like being intentional. Jesus wants to give us something and not take something from us, like our time.

Won't you come and see. I hope our Saint Alban's kids don't miss out on this blessing to learn about who Jesus is, so they too can have an intimate relationship that begins now.



Kroger Plus Shopper's Card Program

Once again, St. Alban's has joined the Kroger Neighbor-To-Neighbor program to take advantage of Kroger's generosity in supporting the community. Our parish will receive a portion of the \$1,000,000 that Kroger will distribute next May based on the proportion of our purchases compared to the total amount all the participating groups spend at Kroger Food Stores. In order for your purchases to be applied to our total, simply have the cashier scan your Kroger Plus shopper's card and then scan this barcode the next time you shop. 


