

Dear Parishioners

The weather is turning colder. It is telling me the time for preparation for Christmas is coming quickly. Advent is here!

On December 7th at 5:30 p.m. we will have Advent Lessons and Carols. This is a beautiful service as we focus upon the scripture and music that leads us in our preparation of welcoming the Christ. There will be a delicious Pork Loin Dinner following the Lessons and Carols. Please remember to bring a Potluck Dish or a Dessert to share with others. There will be no 5:30 Eucharist on this Sunday due to Lessons and Carols.

On December 21st we will have the celebration of the 25th Anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood. It has been a very quick twenty-five years for me and I believe I have been very blessed to serve the Lord in this calling. I thank God and you for blessings you have so graciously poured out. I cannot tell you what the plans are for this celebration for I do not know. I do know there will be a reception following the 10:30 Eucharist this day and I hope you will be able to join us.

Advent takes on a penitential nature as part of our preparation. This preparation is also mixed with joy because we are preparing to celebrate our Lord's birth as we also prepare for his coming again. We do not sing the Gloria during Advent but do sing the Kyrie, "Lord have mercy upon us." We continue to sing or say Alleluia during Advent and we change to Rite I during Advent also because of its sacrificial emphasis. The Cross and the Incarnation can never be separated and we must hold these two doctrines as the basis of our faith.



December 24th we will have a 5:30 p.m. Eucharist with a children's sermon. Our next Eucharist will be at 8:00 pm which will be a sung Eucharist with no incense. Our 10:30 p.m. Eucharist will be a solemn high Eucharist with incense. Both our 8:00 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. we will have musicians accompanying to help in making it a joyous celebration. On Christmas Day we will have a said Eucharist with Dorothy Lynn Brooks accompanying with harp. I want to thank Dorothy for sharing this exceptional and beautiful ministry with us.

Our youth will present on The Second Sunday of Christmas, January 4th, with the tale of "The Friendly Beast" during the 10:30 Eucharist. You won't want to miss this delightful play. You also won't want to miss the fajita lunch following the 10:30 Eucharist.

As we move through this holy season of Advent to prepare our hearts and minds and souls for the coming of our Lord and as we celebrate the Incarnation of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ let us not forget those in need. Our Advent Project is in need of donations, food and workers to help prepare the food and gifts for those families in need. Please volunteer to help as many of these families depend upon this gift of love. Our Night Shelter ministry is also seeing an increase in need. St. Alban's commits to the third Saturday of the month. We are always in need of funds to buy food and volunteers to make sandwiches during the year.

If you have a spare hour once a week and are looking for something to do, we have a very easy ministry but a very important one. We are looking for someone once a week to come in and replenish the envelopes, sharpen pencils, straighten up the books and clean any trash left from Sunday's services. If you can help, please let the Church Office know.

I would like to thank Reagan White for teaching Living the Good News. I sat in on his first class and it was excellent. If you are not part of another Adult Christian Education Class I highly recommend that you join us. It is an excellent way to grow in the knowledge and love of our Lord.

I would also like to thank Doug Hosea and the Development Committee. Doug has been overseeing the repair work necessitated by the hail damage. This was a large project. Our new roof on the Church and the rest of the other buildings are done except taking care of the "punch list" a list of little things here and there that still need to be completed. The floor in the entrance is done. The ceiling has been repaired in the Narthex. We are still waiting for the painting of the Narthex to be done as well as the return of our stained glass window sections. Yet to be done is the skylight in the Narthex and the removal and repair of the Rose Window above the Altar. I believe our choices have greatly enhanced the beauty of our buildings and indeed are a great improvement. Thank you to all who have been involved in this major repair project. Remember these funds came from our Insurance policies we have to cover such a large loss.

Our Capital Campaign projects have also been moving forward during this time. We have a new phone system. We have new heating and air conditioning for the Church. We are almost finished with painting the outside of the Church-doesn't it look great! Information and costs are being gathered about repairing or replacing our pews so they won't pinch any one. Information on costs and strategy for implementing our new parish hall plans are also being gathered. Installing an elevator is part of those plans so all may have access to the upstairs classrooms. Did you know we already have an elevator shaft? You can also tell the great difference with the lighting project that is nearing completion in the Church. I would like to thank Gretchen Hosea for her expertise in lighting for helping us so greatly with this project. Unfortunately the last information we have is the new pendant lights will not be arriving in time to have them installed for Christmas. But the new system will be complete except for adjustments when the new pendant lights are installed. These things are all being done because of you. I thank you for all your love and support of your Parish through the

Capital Campaign.

As I conclude this article, I cannot but help realize just how many blessings we have been given. I thank you Lord for all the blessings you have bestowed upon us at St. Alban's. May we be faithful to your Incarnate Word and praise your name for all the wonders and blessings you have so generously given us.

May God keep safe all those traveling this holiday season. I wish and pray that all of you may have a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Music Corner

Tales From The Loft:

I went to Ross King's shop this week to see our new south case. It will be larger than our new north case. It is taller at the peak, about a foot deeper, and two feet wider. Ross had an architect come and meet with us before he finished the drawings and the architect felt that the two cases would compliment each other. The new case is still in its formative stage but you can see the size and shape. The artisans are also working on the toe boards on which the pipes sit. Of course, we will need to be patient for the delivery of the pipes. Still no time line as to when we can expect delivery.

In addition to the new case we have the funds for the following ranks: Chimneyflute 8', Viola 8', Principal 8', Principal 4', Celeste 8', Gedeckt 16', Flute 4', and Nazard 2 2/3'. We are now working to accumulate the funds for the Blockflute 2' costing \$4,799. This rank will complete the flute chorus of Chimneyflute 8', Flute 4', and Blockflute 2'. After we finish the pipes that play on the upper manual (swell), there are some additional ranks of pipes that play on the pedal. Then there are two fun ranks: chimes and zimbelstern. Total additional funds that is needed to complete the plan is \$60,648. We are almost there!


