Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the April Vestry meetings were approved via email.

Rector's Report

The past month has included three funerals and a wedding. Two parishioners have been in rehab hospitals. We held a Baccalaureate for our School, a meeting with the chair for Kountry Kitchen, a meeting with a development prospect for the 4th street property, a financial meeting for the School, a meeting with the auditors, a meeting with the Communication Committee and a sex and Bible talk with our youth. It has been a very busy month with pastoral care, priestly functions, and administrative duties.

The Vestry was informed that there are fees for clean up that are not covered in contract by Do Rite Cleaning Service. Because they are an independent contractor, we cannot set the fee, but we have to inform people that a clean-up fee is charged for events. There is a \$150.00 fee for clean up of large events and medium events that require clean up of the kitchen and parish hall with food served. There is a \$100.00 fee for clean up of the Parish Hall only.

The Finance Committee has been asked to research the previous borrowing from restricted funds by the Vestry, the need to repay dollars borrowed, and to determine what designates restricted funds.

Every Vestry committee is asked to continue meeting during the summer in order to solidify plans for the fall.

Fr. K will be attending the General Convention from June 15 through June 21 and asks that St. Alban's be kept in parishioners' prayers. Due to Fr. K's absence, he has requested June's Vestry meeting be rescheduled for June 28, 2006.

Stewardship Committee - Kathy Jones

The Stewardship Committee met on Wednesday, May 10 at 7:00pm. Present were Susan Hekman, Kathy Jones, and Stephen Vinson. The following topics were discussed:

- 2006 Pledges: 225 pledges have been received for a total of \$518, 606. The average pledge is \$2,304.92.
- Plate and pledge receipts were down in April but year-to-date giving is above budget.
- Another article by guest contributor Michael Redpath was included in the May issue of **The Legate.**
- A second list of 2006 pledgers was submitted for the June newsletter as we continue to thank parishioners who pledged and encourage those who have not.
- It was suggested that the kick-off event for the fall pledge campaign be held on the church campus.
- Next committee meeting will be on Wednesday, June 7th at 7 p.m. New members are welcome.
