Treasurer's Report/Finance Committee - Bill Richardson; Bob Yarger, Sara Beall

- Pledge and Plate income for August 2009 was \$44,900.00, (\$5,500 more than the budgeted amount of 39,400.00.)
- August expenses were \$45,000, (\$7,200 less than the budgeted amount of \$52,200.00).
- Year to Date Pledge and Plate income is \$357,700.00 (\$34,300 more than the budgeted YTD amount of \$323,400.00)
- Year to Date Expenses are \$407,300 (\$38,000 less than budgeted YTD amount of \$445, 300)

- Year to Date deficit is \$49,600 (\$72,300 less than budgeted YTD deficit of \$121,900). If the current trend of income and expense continues, we expect to further reduce the annual projected deficit to \$64K or less.
- Total due to the line of credit is \$27,244. We have not needed to borrow from the line of credit since January EOM.
- Notable payments from dedicated accounts in August were:
 - \$45,533 from Capital Campaign for following items: Pews @ \$32,933, Parish Hall Air Conditioning @ \$6500 and Preparation and Refinishing of Choir Loft and Nave Floors @ \$6100).
 - \$11,469 from Organ Fund for continuing work by Ross King
- Mortgage Refinancing Update- Despite the approval of our refinancing by Compass Bank's loan committee, delays continue. To process our refinancing, they require something called an "entity document" which we have so far been unable to obtain. Communications with the bank will continue this week and we will attempt to overcome this remaining hurdle. Although we are all frustrated by this on-going saga, it should be remembered that our loan has been approved by their loan committee and that the deal waives significant closing cost items which we would incur if we refinance elsewhere. The vestry discussed the delay in refinancing our mortgage loan. Sue Hogg made a motion for Bill Richardson to investigate refinancing our mortgage loans at another bank. Jim Swann seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

- The classrooms for children and youth and children's chapel were painted and renewed with a fresh look and in some cases, location for our Fall 2009.
- Classes began September 13th. We had 5 PreK/K, 7 Elementary, 3 Youth, 30 Adults.

- Susie Wheaton met with Canon Blewett, author of "Gospel Discipleship Formation" ie The Jesus Method, to learn about this mentoring program for use with those seeking confirmation. Susie believes this would be a very beneficial process to deepen our faith, strengthen our Christian commitments, and relationships among our SAEC family, now and in the future. Although, it is too late to begin this process this year, for our 7

confirmation students, it is something we should consider. It would require very committed clergy and laity. It is a weekly meeting September - May, with the confirmation following. More than a general study of 'History, Tradition, Sacraments and Scripture', the process has resulted in increased leadership and action among participants, vs 'rarely seeing the newly confirmed or newly baptized again', that is often common. Those with a passion for the goals of Newcomers and Ultreya would be gifted for this ministry.

- Prayers and Squares has had a wonderful response as this new outreach ministry organizes. The national headquarters has designated Chapter 895 will be at St. Alban's and we have 16 women ready to make prayer quilts and prayer squares. After two organizational meetings in September, the group will have a workday on Saturday, October 3rd at 9am in room 10. We will have sewing machines, ironing boards and work tables for the preparation, teaching and sewing of the quilts and squares. We have tied with prayers two quilts given from St. Alban's so far. Request forms for prayer quilts are available in the narthex. We are thankful that this ministry has been so well received by the clergy and parishioners of St. Alban's.
- St. Alban's Ultreya has had a busy fall. The Rally Day table was manned by members of the Ultreya in order to explain this method of strengthening the spiritual lives of Christians. Ultreya members also met in August and in September in order to support

each other and to provide support for Cursillo #278 which was held at All Saints Camp on September 17-20. All of the Ultreya events and gatherings have been well attended. A gathering of over forty members and guests greeted them on their return home and enjoyed hearing their observations of the weekend.

• Sowing Seeds- We had our best rally day this year since the start of the sowing seeds. Thanks to our lobbyist on the floor of the parish hall, Ty "bring the young ones in" Head for recruiting all those folks. There are nine new members which will make the total roster to be 24 people in sowing seeds this year. • The group met on September 10 to discuss the next program. It was decided to not purchase the 2010 Living Stewardship program as a follow-up to their program from last year. A tri-fold Narrative Budget brochure will be developed this year, which will be sent out immediately after the Bishop's visit on October 4. A letter to the parish will go out at the end of September delineating all the blessings this parish has received over the past year. This will lead to the theme of Dream Big for the brochure, which will focus on the big ticket items each ministry could initiate with increased proportional giving by the congregation.

- Sara Beall and her new son-in-law graciously added a new hose bib and hose reel to the playground to allow better access to water when cleaning the playground. They also added hose reels outside the Altar Guild room and outside the cry room.

- Air Conditioning System above the Kitchen had to be replaced.
- We had some leaks during the recent heavy rains that were coming from the same transition where the upper level joins the flat roof lower level. CMR construction sent a crew to replace the flashing along this transition to solve the problem.
- Locks were repaired at the entrance to the Narthex and the glass door entrance to the parish hall.

- Development Committee did not meet since the last vestry meeting
- Capital Campaign Finances: Current Balance \$255,622

Current obligations \$240 (6 pew cushions)

Forward Balance \$255,382

- Marsee Garden Work on Phase I of the Marsee Memorial Garden is complete. The columbarium cannot be constructed as originally designed, which was in two stages. The original design had the structure installed in phase one and the granite niches and top to be installed in phase two. The cost of the total columbarium is around \$16,000, of which we need an additional \$11,200 to complete. The vestry discussed Phase II of the project. Doug Hosea will investigate options and present a recommendation to the vestry.
- Church Pews- New Church pews and Altar furniture have been installed. Project complete.
- Choir Loft- Choir loft floor was stripped to the best ability and refinished. Previous polyurethane coat prevented some spots from absorbing the new finish, but overall was much better than before. New organ case construction is still ongoing.
- Parish Hall- We have obtained the contact information for two additional architectural firms that have parish hall renovation experience and will be contacting them to present to the development committee. Along with Cameron Alread, that will make three architects from which to make our choice.
